Each of us is filled with unique and powerful gifts. The GIFTS Fair is a great occasion to learn about the many ways people at Holy Trinity use their gifts to serve others in Christ's name. Parish-wide Flu Shot Clinic — Today from 10 a.m. - 1:30 p.m. in conjunction with the GIFTS Fair. School age children are welcome, but the nasal mist will not be available. The quadrivalent flu immunization shot that will be provided is full coverage for youth and adults and is covered by all insurance carriers and Medicare. The High Dose Fluzone immunization will not be available. The CDC does not have a recommendation of one flu immunization over the other, including the Fluzone. Our senior members need to contact their primary physician to get their suggestion on the Full cover flu shot or the Fluzone High Dose. All insurances will be accepted except Medicaid. Medicaid patients must go to the clinic listed on their Medicaid card. Medicare is accepted. Thank you to the Lake Jeannette Urgent Care for their help offering this clinic.
