Las Posadas — This is the eighth Advent that we will embrace the tradition of Las Posadas. Each night of Advent, a doll-sized holy family will travel from parish family to parish family recreating Mary and Joseph's search for a place to stay as they traveled to Bethlehem. The requirements are simple: be willing to open your home to the holy family, care for them for 24 hours, and deliver them to the next household. Mary, Joseph and the donkey travel in a basket with the book The Night of Las Posadas, a CD of Christmas music, and a journal to record the holy family's activities. Parents and children can plan where they will house the holy family, talk about what they might need, and reflect on the meaning of the season of Advent. - The Season of the Nativity for Families: The full season of the Nativity includes Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany.
