Summer at Holy Trinity — Construction on the Parish House and Broome Hall has begun. So as of now, Nursery Care, Sunday School, Children’s Chapel, and Wednesday evening programming are suspended until fall. Families with young children are invited to worship in All Saints Chapel this summer, where children can move around and make noise. Vacation Bible School and Summer Outreach Adventure will not be held this summer. We apologize for the inconvenience, but our programs for children and families will be back in the fall in newly updated facilities. Thanks for your understanding and cooperation.

Fall Start-up Schedule — Labor Day weekend will be the last Sunday of our summer service schedule. We will return to three church services (8 a.m., 9 a.m., and 11:15 a.m. on Sunday, **September 10**, and Stillpoint will resume **September 12**. We plan to re-open the nurseries on **Sunday, September 23** for children birth – 4years. Room 105 is for birth until children are toilet trained and Room 103 is for toilet trained children through 4 years. The nurseries are open 8:45 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. on Sunday mornings. Sunday School for children and adults is scheduled to begin again on **Sunday, October 7**, and all Wednesday activities will resume **Wednesday, October 10** including Children’s Choirs, Wednesday evening supper, and Kids of the Kingdom childcare.
