LETTER FROM THE INTERIM RECTOR

Grace and Peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ! I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. **Philippians 1:1-5**

Dear People of Holy Trinity,

The words above, attributed to the Apostle Paul, have been ringing in my ears since the confirmation of my call to serve with you as your Interim Rector. I could not be happier or more excited to join a parish family in progress, with so rich a history of sharing in the Gospel! I know that feeling will grow and grow as we live, serve, pray and play together in the coming year. My first day among you will be August 1st. Therefore, my first Sunday will be August 4th. I hope to catch a first glimpse of you at that time.

I am relatively new to the work of Interim Ministry, but come very prepared. This will be my third parish to serve as an Interim, following five years as a Transition Minister in the Diocese of East Tennessee, where I recruited, trained, supported and learned from talented and seasoned interim ministers. This special form of service to the church has been an exciting challenge for me and an exhilarating experience in my years of service in the church. I will also be able to draw on my experience of serving at St. Luke's in Atlanta, an urban, corporate congregation that has many similarities to Holy Trinity – and as I am learning, a couple of shared parishioners! The Episcopal Church is like that – small enough that we can find friends wherever we go!

Many parishes see the time of transition as a drudgery. Or folks can grow tired and anxious about the future and the many steps it takes to call a new ordained leader. This is especially something that can happen when a parish undertakes this transition of leadership after a rector's long tenure. I am hopeful that we can discover together that this interim, or liminal, threshold time, can be one of new awareness, deepening commitment, productive reflection and lots of fun. Holy Trinity has established itself well as a place of meaningful worship, loving service, real spiritual growth and transformation; a place that is welcoming and aware. I look forward to being part of that tradition which will inform and enable you to make good choices, grow in the knowledge and love of the Lord, and provide for the future, as you have so ably done in the past.

I also look forward to working with your excellent staff, your vestry and lay leaders – all the talented and generous folks that make Holy Trinity work!

I love stories and am excited to hear all of yours. I also love poetry and often find that in the economy of the poet's verse, some things can be said better than I could ever manage. One of my favorite poets is Wendell Berry – and perhaps my favorite poem is his "Wild Geese." The poem is about a horseback ride he and his wife take one Sunday in late fall. As they move through fields of harvested crops, they note signs of both life and death – the end of summer's bounty right next to the promise of the future in a waiting persimmon seed. Berry seems to understand, as Jesus did, that in the midst of things passing, even of death, we are always awaiting new life – this is the foundation of our faith. The end of the poem seems especially meant for you; see if you agree:

Geese appear high over us, pass, and the sky closes. Abandon, as in love or sleep, holds them to their way, clear in the ancient faith: what we need is here. And we pray, not for new earth or heaven, but to be quiet in heart, and in eye, clear.

What we need is here.

What we need is here. God is with us and is doing something new. I am filled with joy and hope at the prospect of perceiving through you and with you just what that new thing will be all about – and what cherished things will sustain us, what gifts of the past and the potential of the future that we will hold onto, clear in our ancient faith.

May God continue to bless you in the measure you have been a blessing to each other and to the city of Greensboro and beyond. See you very soon!

Update on Construction:

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

I wanted to give you an update on the church's renovation and let you know how the project will conclude. The Architect issued a "substantial notice of completion" on April 2nd. This means that the contracted work is complete. Since that date, the contractor has been working through a "punchlist" of items that needed to be touched up or reworked. On July 22nd, the Contractor completed those remaining items. The project work carries a 1 year warranty; this warranty period extends through April 1, 2020. During this time, the church will notify the contractor of any items related to the project which need additional work. This could be anything from plumbing leaks, air conditioning issues, or landscape materials which might have died. All items will continue to be addressed during this warranty period. Approximately one month before the warranty period ends, the Church, the Architect and Engineers, and the Contractor will conduct a survey of the project to account for any items which require final attention from the Contractor.

I hope you are enjoying the new spaces!
