Flu Season — If you are concerned about the spread of the flu, we remind you during the passing of peace that a slight nod or bow of the head acknowledges you care for those around you and you are welcome to partake of only the bread at communion. In our tradition, crossing your arms over your chest when the cup is presented indicates to the chalice-bearer that you will not drink from it. The words of administration will still be said ("The blood of Christ, the cup of salvation"). The bread alone conveys fullness of grace.

Thomas Merton Pilgrimage: October 10-13, 2019. Join the Rev's Greg Farrand and Mark Lile-King as we walk in the footsteps of Thomas Merton. Our pilgrimage begins at Shaker Village of Pleasant Hill near Harrodsburg, Kentucky. For Merton, the Shakers' simple life created a transforming environment for awaking the spiritual life. The group will stay overnight in restored Shaker Village buildings and then travel to the Abbey of Gethsemani located in Trappist, Kentucky, where Merton lived for almost 30 years. For two days, the group will live in a monastic milieu that offers a place, as Merton writes, "to entertain silence in the heart and listen for the voice of God—to pray for your own discovery." Walking the Abbey grounds, gathering for worship with the monks (monks worship 8 times daily), and quiet contemplation will frame our Merton experience. We'll spend two nights in the monk's retreat house and practice simplicity at mealtime with the monks. Cost is \$625.00.
